1. 대화를 듣고, 남자가 그린 집을 고르시오.

M: Whew! Finally I've finished my home economics assignment!

W: Can I have a look? Oh, it's a beautiful two-story house. You did a great job.

M: Thanks. Actually I've spent a lot of time drawing this house. It was very tough.
